
What is a

Health Science Program and Health Science Program Academic Accreditation?

A health science program is a bachelor's level degree program that provides prerequisites for entry to a profession, a specific program, or prepares students for work in the healthcare field.

Health Science Program Accreditation is awarded by CAHIIM when the program demonstrates quality education aligned with the Accreditation Standards.

Why is it important for academic programs to be accredited?



- Students who want federal grants and loans need to attend a college, university or program that is accredited.
- Employers of graduates want validation of the quality of the academic credential.
- Student and parents want reassured of the quality of the education program
- The federal government requires that a college, university, or program be accredited in order to be eligible for federal grants and loans or other federal funds.
- Accreditation may facilitate credit transfer and recognition of quality academic credential

Process

What does the Accreditation Process Involve?



The process involves an initial application, a self-study submission, and thorough evaluation of the program's infrastructure, curriculum, faculty and program director qualifications, student outcomes, and other important points of interest.

Accreditation Process Training

Accredited programs receive complimentary access to the CAHIIM Accreditation Process Training materials to help guide them through the accreditation process.

Town Halls

Accredited programs enjoy complimentary access to monthly Town Halls virtual sessions, addressing topics relevant to current demands.

Resources


Programs receive shared research and data analysis of program outcomes for comparison with their own programs.

Faculty Fellowship & Badging

Faculty from accredited programs may apply to the CAHIIM fellowship program or for faculty badging, recognizing their contributions to quality education and the educational communities.

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Application Requirements



Conditions for Pre-Application

The following requirements must be met or completed when submitting an application:

- **Program Director**: Have hired or are in the process of hiring a permanent full-time Program Director who holds a minimum master's degree.
- Faculty Member: Have faculty member(s) fully dedicated to the program.
- **Applicant Program Campus**: The program and campus applying for accreditation must award the degree which includes online applicant campuses.
- Other campus institutional requirements: The sponsoring institution is accredited by a regional or national accrediting institutional organization recognized by the U.S. Department of Education (USDE) to offer a degree, or the sponsoring institution accredited by a national accreditor with USDE provisions their Grant for Accreditation for establishing eligibility to participate in Title IV programs.

The Health Science Accreditation Process

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LETTER OF INTENT (LOI)

Once the program verifies it meets the minimum application requirements and has commenced enrollments, the program's President/CEO submits a LOI indicating their readiness for accreditation.

PROGRAM SUBMITS APPLICATION

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APPLICATION REVIEWED

Program application is reviewed and CAHIIM assessment is provided within 90 days.

CANDIDACY STATUS GRANTED

Upon acceptance into Candidacy Status, the program is assigned an EPC code and a self-assessment due date. The Candidacy Status fee is then invoiced.

The Health Science Accreditation Process



PROGRAM SUBMITS SELF-ASSESSMENT

The program is provided with a due date for their self-assessment. Early submissions are encouraged.

SELF-ASSESSMENT REVIEWED

A preliminary assessment is provided by CAHIIM staff within 90 days and a site visit date is coordinated.



SITE VISIT CONDUCTED

The site visit occurs over 1.5 days and the report is generated within 10 days.

PROGRAM SUBMITS RESPONSE

The program's response to the site visit report is due within 30 days.

The Health Science Accreditation Process



COUNCIL REVIEW

The Council examines the program's response to ensure adherence to the Accreditation Standards and provides a recommendation regarding the program's accreditation status.

BOARD REVIEW

The CAHIIM Board examines the Council's recommendation and takes a final vote regarding the accreditation status of the program.



PROGRAM NOTIFICATION

Program is notified of the Boards decision within 10 days.

PROGRESS REPORT

The program may be required to submit a 6-month progress report on any deficiencies noted. Full accreditation status is not granted until all CAHIIM Accreditation Standards are met.

With the exception of the annual accreditation fee, these fees are invoiced once in seven-years, aligning with the life of the accreditation cycle.
